- The Course Description Book is your primary resource for information about classes and their prerequisites. You will find this on the district webpage under the curriculum tab for secondary education.

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

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



SCIENCE INFORMATION

Block Science is no longer offered as a combined course. If students are looking to take two science courses in their freshman year, they will take Physical Science and Biology concurrently as two separate courses. Please keep in mind that if a student is planning on doing this, it is recommended that they are currently in Algebra 1 (or higher) and will be moving to Geometry (or higher) in their freshman year.

BIG HISTORY

Big History is a year-long course about the significant questions and changes in the history of the world – from the Big Bang theory (as taught in 8th grade Earth Science) to events in modern times. From the subatomic to the universal, from the local to the global, Big History teaches students to consider their world from many different perspectives and to look for patterns to make sense of how change occurred. This course is interdisciplinary and appeals to those who have an interest in science as well.


HONORS LANGUAGE ARTS 9 INFORMATION

Higher level thinking, reading, and writing skills are needed for this class. There is an application required in order to take this class. The middle school will communicate information regarding the application. Sukhers will have required reading over the summer and may be asked to complete some assignments based on that reading over the summer as well. For student who need to improve their writing skills, it is recommended that they take Language Arts 9 and may enter into the honors and/or AC univolum in a different year.

Science

3 credits Required

Box A -Required Courses

Freshmen are required to take a full year of Physical Science

- If you have strong interest in science and would like to add Bio, in addition to Phy Sci, you may do so by adding Biology in one of your elective spots
 - It is recommended that you are currently in Algebra 1 (or higher) and will be moving to Geometry (or higher) in your freshman year.

Math

4 credits Required



Freshmen are required to take a full year of math

- Consider Honors If you are in Algebra 1 (or higher) and doing well in your current math class.
- If you are in Algebra 1 and not doing well, consider retaking Algebra 1 in your freshman year.
- Please consult with your first semester math teacher for placement recommendation.

 Participation in 2 seasons of a RCS approved MHSAA Sport or Marching Band is equivalent to 0.5 PE
- Flex form must be turned in to counseling
- Health is required with this option


Zero Hour - Marching & Jazz Band






